

Ways Family Members Can Be Involved In Our School

At Broomfield Academy we value the active involvement of family members (parents, grandparents, aunts, uncles, etc.). Through active and engaged partnerships, we strengthen the programs and experiences of each child enrolled at our school. We thank you for your participation in your child's education. Some ways that family members can be involved in our school follow. Please contact the Principal or the front office if you wish to assist in any of these ways. Or, find a new way to help and we'll add it to this list!

1. Assist at the school.

- a. Share information with a class about a hobby or career.
- b. Share information about a country you have visited or in which you have lived.
- c. Tutor one or a small group of students in reading, math, or other subject area.
- d. Help coach an athletic team or an occasional 'pick-up' game.
- e. Become a Junior Achievement classroom volunteer.
- f. Become a volunteer for Boy Scouts or Girl Scouts.
- g. Help put up class bulletin boards or displays.
- h. Help build, paint or repair something (such as a picnic table, a sandbox or a classroom).
- i. Help answer the school phone or help call prospective families.
- j. Demonstrate cooking from a particular country or culture to students.
- k. Help with our outdoor teaching garden or work on a project to beautify the school. Help with the landscaping or planting.

2. Help arrange learning opportunities in the community.

- a. Help set up an internship or apprenticeship for an upper grades student at your business, organization or agency.
- b. Go on a local field trip with a teacher and a group of students.
- c. Contact a local business or organization regarding possible cooperation.

3. Serve on an advisory or decision-making committee.

- a. Serve on the Parent Advisory Council (PAC).
- b. Serve as a Parent Ambassador welcoming new families.
- c. Lead PAC projects such as our Winter Arts Festival Auction, Spring Cocktail party, or Teacher Appreciation Week.

4. Share information or advocate for the school.

- a. Go to schools, restaurants, websites, and child-friendly programs in the community to provide information about Broomfield Academy.
- b. Help translate information from the school into a language other than English.
- c. Volunteer to speak with prospective families about our school and programs.
- d. Write an article for publication in a magazine about Broomfield Academy activities and events.
- e. Help with posting school events on a variety of websites.
- f. Help arrange for a political leader (mayor, city council, state representative, member of Congress) to visit the school.

5. Increase financial resources available to the school.
